MYERS, MARTIN, AND WINKLEPLECK DOMINATE AT MILWAUKIE ADDING ANOTHER N.W.S.T. TITLE TO THEIR COLLECTION

Milwaukie Bowl was host to the annual 40-50-60 Trio Swiss on Saturday, May 3. A full field of 16 teams competed over 8 games in a match-play format, with points awarded for individual and team victories.

As is tradition with the Milwaukie Trio Swiss, a unique bonus-point system was used. Bowlers added to their team's totals by posting games of 235+ and 255+. A team shooting a game of 705+ also earned a point toward their total score. The tournament champion would be determined based upon the teams' overall point production.

The team of Tim Myers, Mike Martin, and Jim Winklepleck, all previous winners of this event, opened up a slim four-point lead through the tournament's first three rounds. They increased their margin to eight in round four, earning 11 points in their 750-665 victory over "Pure Seed's" Dean Hebner, Bill Neumann, and Ron Martinson. The "Mymartinpleck" trio was led by Martin's 258 and Winklepleck's 255.

Milwaukie Bowl's IDK squad of Mike Polinsky, Johnny More, and John West trailed in second place with 25 points. More, the super senior of the group, led the way with opening games of 263 and 259 en route to a 4-0 match-play record. The Washington trio of Scott Schimming, Bob Sturdevant, and Scott Halvarson were a point behind in third, with Halvarson leading all tournament bowlers with a 250 per game average through the first four rounds.

Individual highlights included a pair of 300 games fired by Washington and Oregon bowlers. Graham left-hander Ronnie Noel posted his perfect game in round two, while Beaverton's Jeff Drake followed with one of his own in round four.

Portland's Jim Winklepleck posted the tournament's third 300 game in round five, leading his team to a 748-643 victory over IDK. With the win, "Mymartinpleck" extended their lead to eleven with 42 total points. Scott Schimming fired a game of 278 to move his squad into second place.

Black Moon Pro Shop, comprising a trio of N.W.S.T. titleholders, moved into third-place contention. Astoria's Jon Gustafson rolled a game of 279 to lead teammates Jeff Knapp and Mike Kelly to a five-round total of 29 points.

Molalla Bowl and IDK sat in a tie for fifth with 24 points. The Molalla threesome of Tracy Teeters, Bill Starnes, and Shawn Copeland led Polinsky, More, and West in total pins, 3416 to 3386.

Led by Tim Myers games of 259 and 278 in rounds six and seven, "MyMartinPleck" had strung together four consecutive wins with team games of 700+. Their round-seven

victory over IDK, 707-655, gave the trio of N.W.S.T. titleists 57.5 in total points, establishing an insurmountable lead with only one tournament game remaining. Scott Halvarson posted a score of 240 to return the "Schimmings" squad to second place with 38 points. IDK's loss to the tournament leaders dropped the team of right-handers to third with 33.5 points.

Surina's Pro Shop climbed into the top five for the first time with 33 total points, lead by Mike Karch's game of 256. Teammates Matt Surina and Jodey Rees added scores of 216 and 225 to overpower the "Pure Seed" trio of Hebner, Neumann, and Martinson, 697-625.

Two other Washington squads were tied for fifth place with 32 points each. Despite a round-seven loss to "Schimmings", 680-629, Black Moon Pro Shop held an advantage of 66 pins over "Oh Gawd, Part 3." Jerry Ledbetter fired a game of 265 to carry his "Oh Gawd" partners of Mitch Vernon and Ronnie Noel to a 693-587 win over Molalla Bowl.

Round seven was highlighted by Mike Ewing's 300 game. Teammates Bob Korth and Steve Michaliszyn added scores of 245 and 225. Their 770 series would earn the group the "high-game-out-of-the-money" at tournaments end.

With the championship already decided, the spotlight shifted to the teams still in contention to collect a top-five check. "Schimmings" defeated Mymartinpleck" in the tournament's final round, 694-607, securing a second-place finish with 43 total points. All three bowlers contributed to the victory, with Scott Halvarson rolling a game of 238, followed by Bob Sturdevant's 232, and Scott Schimming's 224. Despite their loss, Tim Myers, Mike Martin, and Jim Winklepleck claimed the championship with a dominating total of 59.5 points.

Surina's Pro Shop improved to third place with 41 points overall, collecting 8 points in their sweep of IDK, 721-632. Jodey Rees led the way with a game of 268, followed by Matt Surina's 233, and Mike Karch's 220. The loss dropped Mike Polinsky, Johnny More, and John West to fifth with 35.5 total points.

Jerry Ledbetter helped his "Oh Gawd" squad to a narrow 657-638 win over Black Moon Pro Shop, securing a fourth-place finish with 36 points in total. The Puyallup super senior closed with a flourish, posting a game of 247 to win his fifth consecutive match. The loss dropped Jeff Knapp, Jon Gustafson, and Mike Kelly to seventh with a total of 34 points. Kurt Bogner, Ray Hix, and Jason Lower defeated "Pure Seed," 691-646, falling just short of a fifth-place check with 35 total points.

With their tournament win, the "Mymartinpleck" trio added to their already impressive N.W.S.T. resumes. Tim Myers collected his third consecutive title and fourth overall for the 2013-14 season. As a 12-time champion, the Milwaukie right-hander joins N.W.S.T. Hall-of-Famers Marlin Alvis, Bob Humbert, and Curtis Dornath in a tie for third on the career title list. Albany's Walt Lundgren tops the list with 21 championships to his credit.

Mike Martin and Jim Winklepleck moved into a tie for seventh on the same list with 11 career titles to their name. Winklepleck also became a back-to-back winner of this event, having teamed with Mike Karch and Matt Surina to win the 2013 Milwaukie Swiss Trio.

In top individual performances, Jim Winklepleck led all bowlers with a 243 per game average on total pinfall of 1948. Lakewood right-hander Scott Halvarson and Tim Myers followed with totals of 1931 and 1913 for averages of 241 and 239 per game. Oregon seniors Mike Ewing and Ron Martinson rounded out the top five, both with 1905 in total pins for a 238 per game pace.

Winklepleck, Halvarson, and Myers led all competitors with 7 win, 1 loss match-play records. Ewing, Kurt Bogner, Jeff Drake, Jerry Ledbetter, and Jon Gustafson each collected 6 wins in head-to-head competition. Besides the four 300 games posted in the tournament, Beaverton's Dan McElligott added a 287 score to round out the list for the tournament's high individual game.

In other noteworthy tournament statistics, Myers, Martin, and Winklepleck averaged 234 per team member with 5618 in total pins. The second-place trio of Schimming, Sturdevant, and Halvarson followed with a team average of 225 per man on total pinfall of 5415. Despite their fifth-place finish, the IDK squad of Polinsky, More, and West posted the next highest team total, averaging 224 per teammate with a 5383 total. Surina's Pro Shop also averaged 224 as a team, with Rees, Surina, and Karch posting 5380 in total pins.

The Northwest Senior Tour would like to thank proprietor Dave Husted, manager Jeff Combs, and the entire staff of Milwaukie Bowl for their hard work and hospitality. This was their ninth consecutive year as tournament host.

The final tournament of the 2013-14 season is the N.W.S.T.'s second major. The Tour Championship is scheduled for Saturday and Sunday, May 17-18, at Wilsonville Lanes in Wilsonville, Oregon.
